Subject: Police Department Monthly Report for January 2024

Report Summary:

Crime data and monthly departmental activity is summarized with a historical perspective. Numbers are based on actual reports taken by the Frisco Police Department and have not been certified with Texas Department of Public Safety for the year.

Comparative Data:

The Uniform Crime Index number for the month of January 2024 showed a total of 270 part one offenses, which was 72 less reported incidents than in December 2023. Comparing part one offenses from January 2023 to January 2024, those are down 161 reports for a total decrease of 39.58% (per 1000/capita). There was a decrease in general theft related incidents and an increase in burglaries and assaults in January 2024.

Report Analysis:

No murders were reported in January 2024. There was 1 rape reported for January 2024. There was 1 robbery reported in January 2024, which is 4 less than reported in December 2023. There was a total of 87 assaults in January 2024 which is 3 less than in December 2023.

There were 14 burglaries reported in January 2024 compared to 10 reported in December 2023. There were 11 industrial or retail building burglaries in January 2024 and 3 burglaries reported from habitations, apartments, or homes. For January 2024 there were 29 reported vehicle burglaries (BMV's) and 41 reported in December 2023. For motor vehicle thefts, January 2024 reported 13 thefts total and 29 in December 2023. Year 2024 through January, there were 13 reported motor vehicle thefts and in

year 2023 through January there were 12 reported incidents. Calendar year 2023 yielded the highest number of motor vehicle thefts since records were being maintained, with a total of 229 reported incidents.

There were 785 assigned criminal investigations for January 2024 and 807 assigned criminal investigations in the previous month of December 2023. Comparative data from 2023 shows January had 1,046 criminal investigations assigned to investigations.

There were 130 motor vehicle collisions in January 2024, with one fatality collision. Of the 130 total motor vehicle collisions, 108 resulted in an injury to an involved party. In December 2023 there were 179 total motor vehicle collisions, with 118 of them resulting in an injury to an involved party. That is a 27.37% reduction in motor vehicle collisions from December 2023.

There were 10,280 calls for service (CFS) recorded in the month of January 2024 compared to 10,029 CFS in December 2023. January 2024 yielded 224 adult arrests along with 14 juvenile arrests. January 2024 also yielded 45 drug related arrests which is a 40.63% increase from December 2023, which yielded 32 drug related arrests.

There was 1 priority one call for January 2024 and 1,528 priority two calls, resulting in an average response time of 3 minutes 3 seconds for the priority one calls and 8 minutes 43 seconds for priority 2 calls.
