AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRISCO, TEXAS, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 2023-02-06 AND DESIGNATING EIGHT (8) ELECTION PRECINCTS FOR THE MAY 6, 2023 GENERAL ELECTION AND EACH ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE CITY OF FRISCO, COLLIN AND DENTON COUNTIES, TEXAS, THEREAFTER, AS ORDERED BY THE CITY COUNCIL; AUTHORIZING ALL NECESSARY ACTIONS RELATING THERETO; AND PROVIDING A SAVINGS/REPEALING CLAUSE, SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Frisco, Texas ("<u>City Council</u>") finds that it is advantageous and beneficial to the City of Frisco, Texas ("<u>Frisco</u>") and its citizens to designate new election precincts for the May 6, 2023, General Election and all subsequent elections ordered by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the population growth of Frisco necessitates a redesignation of the existing voting precincts, consisting of all areas within the Frisco city limits, for the convenience of the voters and ease of administering elections; and

WHEREAS, by this Ordinance, it is the intention of the City Council to repeal Ordinance No. 2023-02-06, which previously designated election precincts, and to designate eight (8) election precincts in Frisco with modified boundaries and to create a boundary description of each precinct as set forth below; and

WHEREAS, all Council Members and the Mayor shall continue to be elected at-large as required by Section 3.01 of the City Charter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRISCO, TEXAS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: <u>Findings Incorporated</u>. The findings set forth above are incorporated into the body of this Ordinance as if fully set forth herein.

<u>SECTION 2</u>: <u>Repeal of Ordinance No. 2023-02-06</u>. Ordinance No. 2023-02-06 is repealed in its entirety and replaced by this Ordinance. The effective date of the repeal discussed in this Section shall not occur until the effective date of this Ordinance, at which time Ordinance No. 2023-02-06 shall be repealed.

<u>SECTION 3</u>: <u>Designation of Eight (8) Election Precincts</u>. For the May 6, 2023, General Election and all elections ordered by the City Council thereafter, eight (8) election precincts are hereby designated, as depicted in <u>Exhibit A</u>, attached hereto and incorporated herein for all purposes, and described as follows:

- 1. City Precinct 1 consists of those portions of Denton County Precinct Nos. 1018, 1019, 1020, 1033, 1036, 1037, 1039 and 1040 which are located inside the Frisco city limits.
- 2. City Precinct 2 consists of those portions of Collin County Precinct Nos. 30, 92, 111, 177, 184 and 245 which are located inside the Frisco city limits.
- 3. City Precinct 3 consists of those portions of Collin County Precinct Nos. 134, 209, 212, 220, 225, 229 and 248 which are located inside the Frisco city limits.
- 4. City Precinct 4 consists of those portions of Denton County Precinct Nos. 1023, 2080, 2083 and 2089 which are located inside the Frisco city limits.
- 5. City Precinct 5 consists of those portions of Denton County Precinct Nos. 1025, 1026 and 1032 which are located inside the Frisco city limits.
- 6. City Precinct 6 consists of those portions of Denton County Precinct Nos. 1021, 1022, 1024, 2081 and 2082 which are located inside the Frisco city limits.
- 7. City Precinct 7 consists of those portions of Collin County Precinct Nos. 101, 117, 118, 127 and 146 which are located inside the Frisco city limits.
- 8. City Precinct 8 consists of those portions of Collin County Precinct Nos. 87, 234 and 244 which are located inside the Frisco city limits.

Each City Precinct is coterminous with the voting precincts adopted by the Denton County Commissioners Court and the Collin County Commissioners Court, respectively.

<u>SECTION 4</u>: <u>Necessary Actions</u>. The Mayor and the City Secretary, in consultation with the City Attorney, are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions necessary to comply with the provisions of the Texas Elections Code and any other state or federal law in carrying out and designating election precincts, whether or not expressly authorized herein and all actions previously taken are hereby ratified.

<u>SECTION 5</u>: <u>Severability</u>. Should any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional and/or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, it is expressly provided that any and all remaining portions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance, and each section, subsection, clause and phrase thereof regardless of whether any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases may be declared unconstitutional and/or invalid.

<u>SECTION 6</u>: <u>Savings/Repealing</u>. All provisions of any ordinance or resolution in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent they are in conflict. Any remaining portion of conflicting ordinances or resolutions shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 7: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage.
